Corpus Christi: Today is the Feast of Corpus Christi, the Body and Blood of Christ. We welcome all those who have made their First Communion this year to the 12.00 Mass and Eucharistic Procession.

General Parish Meeting: Last Wednesday we held our annual General Parish Meeting in the Middle Hall. After a time of prayer and reflection, during which we considered the different ways in which we can use our gifts and looked at the variety of activities offered at Saint Mungo's, we heard from two members of the community whose lives had been enriched by their contact with Saint Mungo's, one through the Young Adult Group and the other through the R.C.I.A. Both speakers commented on the high level of support and encouragement they received not just from these groups but from the parishioners in general. In addition to the Parish Financial Statement, the main items discussed at the meeting were how to develop ways of welcoming new people who come to the church and how we as a parish community can promote vocations to the priesthood and the religious life. Recommendations made will be taken up by the Parish Pastoral Council.
