Church Unity Octave

To mark the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, the Archdiocese has produced some bookmarks (available at the church door) with this quotation from Pope Benedict XVI's first public message: *We are all called to work tirelessly to rebuild the full visible unity of all Christ's followers. Good intentions are not enough. We need practical gestures that touch the heart and conscience and lead us all to inner conversion.*

Christian Unity: The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity began last Thursday, 18 January, and continues until Thursday, 25 January, the Feast of the Conversion of Saint Paul. To mark Church Unity Week, Glasgow Churches Together (GCT) is holding a Christian Unity Week service today (Sunday) at 3.00 p.m. at Renfield St Stephen's Church of Scotland, 260 Bath Street, Glasgow.

Parish Council: The Parish Pastoral Council meeting, originally scheduled for this week, is postponed until Monday, 5 February; the meeting will be at 7.30 p.m. in the Big Parlour.

Saint Roch's Centenary Book: The Bookshop now has more copies of John Sweeney's fine history of Saint Roch's Parish, which celebrates its centenary this year with a Lenten Mission preached by Father Charles Cross C.P. at the end of February (He's the "Father Charles" who is not being canonised this year!)

Understanding the Catholic Faith: The *Evangelium* course on the Catholic Faith for Adults will continue on Wednesday of this week.
