### Remembering Those Who Have Died

November is the Month of the Holy Souls. Friday of this week, 2 November, is All Souls Day, the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed. It is a day on which we offer Mass for our deceased family and friends. Masses in Saint Mungo's for All Souls Day will be at the usual times: 10.00, 12.15 and 6.00.

**November Dead List:** Papers for the November Dead List are available in the hall, and completed lists and offerings can be placed in the box near the altar. The 12.15 Mass every day during November and the 6.00 Mass every Tuesday throughout the year is offered for those on our November Dead List.

**Book of Remembrance:** On All Souls Day the Book of Remembrance will be opened in the Church. Please feel welcome to write the names of your own deceased family and friends in the book; others will read it and remember to pray for them too. The Book of Remembrance will remain in the Church throughout November.

**All Saints Day:** Thursday, 1 November, is the Feast of All Saints. It is a Holiday of Obligation. Masses in the church will be on Wednesday evening at 6.00 (Vigil Mass) and on Thursday at 10.00 a.m., 12.15 and 7.00 p.m. There will be Mass in Saint Stephen's School at 9.30 a.m. and in Saint Kevin's School at 11.00 a.m. All are welcome to attend the school Masses. Mass in Caledonian University will be at 12.10 p.m. in the new Faith and Belief Centre on the ground floor of the Harley Building. **Because of the Feast of All Saints, there will be no Healing Mass in honour of Saint Charles of Mount Argus this month.**

**The Annual Remembrance Mass** for those who have died during the past year will be at 12.00 next Sunday.
