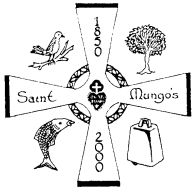

Forty Hours Adoration

The Forty Hours Adoration begins in Saint Mungo's today (Sunday) at the 12.00 Mass. This is a special opportunity for each of us to spend some time in prayer and adoration before Jesus in the Eucharist. Try to set aside a quiet half-hour of personal prayer in the church during the Forty Hours Adoration.

Feast of Saint Mungo: Today is the Feast of Saint Mungo, Patron of our parish, our city and our diocese. We welcome Archbishop Conti, Saint Mungo's successor, as celebrant of the 12.00 Mass today. Archbishop Conti will preach at a historic ecumenical Evening Prayer Service in Glasgow Cathedral, High Street, this evening (Sunday) at 6.30. This event is not-ticketed and all are welcome to attend.

Programme for the Forty Hours: The Forty Hours Adoration begins with the 12.00 Mass which is followed by a Eucharistic Procession. The Church will remain open all day for adoration. There will be a Holy Hour this afternoon at 4.00, after which adoration will continue until the 7.00 p.m. Mass. On Monday and Tuesday, adoration will resume after the 10.00 a.m. Mass and continue until the Holy Hour at 7.30 p.m.

Candles and Flowers: If you wish to have a candle burned for your or your family's intentions, or to make an offering towards the cost of candles and flowers, you can do so at the table at the church door.

Sign up for 40 Hours: If you can spend a half hour in Eucharistic Adoration during the Forty Hours (on Sunday, Monday or Tuesday), please sign the form at the back of the Church. In this way we can make sure that there is always someone praying in the church during the Forty Hours.

World Day for Refugees and Migrants: Today the Catholic Church celebrates the annual World Day for Migrants and refugees. In his message for today, Pope Benedict asks us to remember especially those young people who have to leave their own homes and countries, whether as refugees, migrant workers or students.

Primary School Enrolment: This week, our primary schools are taking enrolments for children who will begin school this year.
