HFE Bill: The Human Fertilisation and Embryology Bill strikes at the heart of what makes us human. If it becomes law, it will permit many new abuses of human beings including the creation of cloned human-animal embryos and genetic modification of human embryos for research. Also, a child's need for a father will not be recognised for some test-tube babies under this bill. If you have not already done so, please write to your Member of Parliament (MP) today to urge him/her to vote against the Bill. You can write to your MP at: House of Commons, London SW1A 0AA. The MP for Townhead is Mohammad Sarwar. The MP for Sighthill and Royston is Michael Martin. As Speaker, Mr Martin will not vote on the Bill, but it would still be helpful for him to receive a letter from you expressing your view.
