November is the Month of the Holy Souls. Next Sunday, 2 November, is All Souls Day, the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed. It is a day on which we offer Mass for our deceased family and friends.

**The Annual Remembrance Mass** for those who have died during the past year will be at 12.00 next Sunday.

**November Dead List:** Papers for the November Dead List are available in the Church, and completed lists and offerings can be placed in the box near the altar. The 12.15 Mass every day during November and the 6.00 Mass every Tuesday throughout the year is offered for those on our November Dead List.

**Book of Remembrance:** Next Sunday, the Book of Remembrance will be opened in the Church. Please feel welcome to write the names of your own deceased family and friends in the book; others will read it and remember to pray for them too. The Book of Remembrance will remain in the Church throughout November.

**All Saints Day:** Saturday of this week is the Feast of All Saints. This year, it is not a Holiday of Obligation.

**Writings of Saint Paul of the Cross:** In the Heart of God, a short book on the spiritual teaching of Saint Paul of the Cross published here at Saint Mungo's, is now available from the Bookshop, priced £2.95.
