This is the question that the disciples asked in that boat on a very stormy sea so many years ago, when Jesus calmed the wind and sea.

This is also a question that many people ask today when they are faced with the understanding that Jesus is with them and takes away their fear and anxieties when they open their heart to Him.

Yes, that is exactly what Jesus did for his disciples, he took away their fear. They looked at what they saw, and were afraid.

They saw Jesus asleep in the boat while they struggled against a strong wind and stormy sea, and they asked Jesus 'Master, do you not care?'

Of course Jesus cares. He cares so much for us that we should always remember that He would not allow our worries to overwhelm us a stormy sea could. But, Jesus need something from us. He needs us to believe.

That is what we need to do, believe in Jesus and the power He has to lead us to safety.

The stormy sea in the gospel today is the troubled world we live in, and the safety that Jesus offers is His love. A love that can overpower even death.
