'faith has restored you'

In the gospel today, we hear of an amazing person. The woman who searches out Jesus to help her has finally come to the understanding of where true healing takes place.

She has been ill for many years and has tried everything she could think of to help her return to health, but nothing has worked. In fact, she has used all she had in trying to find a cure. Then she comes to Jesus. Her faith now is so strong that she believes that even if all she can do is touch the hem of his garment that he will help her. What a strength of faith. And also what a courage she had in struggling through the crowd to reach Jesus.

I wonder if we would have the same courage and faith?

But I also wonder, how did she hear about Jesus? Did one of her friends or family mention him? Was she just fortunate to be in the right place at the right time? I think that her searching out Jesus was the completion of her faith journey as she recognised what a great gift God was offering to the world in his Son. I wonder, are we ready to bring the message of our faith to others? Will we have the courage to speak out? If we do not, then perhaps we may prevent someone from recognising the call of Jesus to them. So, always speak out loud and clear of the love of God for his people.
