In the reading from St Paul today, we are encouraged to lead a good life by acts of charity, selflessness, gentleness and patience.

These words can form for us a very good examination of conscience regarding our relationship to others.

Do I try to help those less fortunate than myself?

Do I share what I have with those around me?

Do I treat others with compassion and respect/

Do I have patience with others even when it inconveniences me?

Four little questions to help us focus each day on where the Lord is leading us. To a life worthy of our vocation, whether that vocation is to the priesthood, religious life, married state, or single life we can always be sure that the Lord Jesus is with us. Why? Because he said so.

This way of life will also allow us to recognise more clearly that there is only one Lord, one faith and one baptism, and that is in God.

So, like St. Paul we also can recognise that as we give our lives to God and become prisoners in the Lord we are **not chained, but free to go and share his word.**
