In the Gospel today, we hear the people complaining about the things that Jesus is saying. 'We know him, we know his father and mother, how can he say these things?'

It must have been very strange for those people to hear Jesus speak about being 'the bread that has come down from heaven.' These same people were amazed by the many signs and miracles that Jesus worked, but could not understand what he was saying when he revealed this message to them. His teaching is about the Eucharist, the same sacrament that we share in at our Mass. Jesus reminds us that it is through the Eucharist that we will have the fullness of life. It is through the Eucharist, that God will strengthen us and nourish us, so that we will have the courage to go out to the world and proclaim God's message. The message from God is for all his people, he wants us to live forever in his presence. He wants us to be strong in our faith. He wants us to share what we have with those less fortunate. He wants us to reach out to the lonely, the sick, and those who feel that life is not worth living. He wants us to be like Jesus and reveal his love for all people by what we say and do. Perhaps, we can try this week to show God's love to others, by the respect we have for each other?
